God's Joy in Generosity



Hello friends,

After the Faith Lift of the first weekend of April, we enter the One Step Stewardship Campaign. We know that generous giving talks about our discipleship and spirituality. It is far more than that! It is something about joy God provides for God's people. Why don't we check with that joy in the Bible?

In 2 Corinthians 8–9, Paul encourages and exhorts the Corinthian Christians to contribute generously to the relief of the suffering believers in Jerusalem. As he does, he describes how God's beautiful economy of grace works to produce a wealth of joy.

He starts by pointing to the grace of God clearly evident in the Macedonian Christians. These believers were living in extreme poverty, and yet they experienced an abundance of joy in being redeemed by Christ, which overflowed in a wealth of generosity in their contribution to the poor in Jerusalem. Then Paul points the Corinthians directly to the grace that Jesus showed them when, “though he was rich, yet for their sake he became poor, so that they by his poverty might become rich”. Then Paul describes how the contribution the Corinthians give will not only supply the needs of the saints but also overflow in many thanksgivings to God.

In other words, this is how God's economy of grace works to produce a wealth of joy for everyone involved: the grace of Jesus overflows in his incredible generosity to redeem and give eternal joy to the Corinthian believers. This grace experienced by the Corinthians and Macedonians produces in them an abundance of joy that overflows in their generous giving to meet the needs of the Jerusalem saints, which also produces joy for them since it is more blessed to give than to receive. This grace of provision produces in the Jerusalem saints an abundance of joy that overflows in thanksgivings to God, not only for his provision, but also for the


surpassing grace of God evident in the Corinthians. And this whole economic cycle of grace glorifies God, the Source of all grace.

Over and over again, God's grace produces joy, which then produces generosity, which then produces joyful thanksgiving and praise back to God. This is God's wonderful kingdom economy, where the true riches of grace and joy are the returns of generous giving to meet the needs of others. Paul wants the Corinthians and us to have as much joy in God as possible, so he's exhorting them to invest in order to see that return.

In God's gracious economy of joy, we don't need to fear running out of grace and joy. Paul wants us to know that if we trust God and invest well in generous giving to meet the needs of others, God will supply every need according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus.

Our giving versus expenses has been experiencing a shortfall for quite a while now. Each month the giving is about \$2000 short to meet the expenses of the church. That shortage has depleted our general budget to a level of concern. The Servant Leadership Board (SLB) has been working closely with the Finance committee regarding this. SLB voted to move money from several funds (that have contained a balance but have not been used in several years) to the General Budget. The Stewardship committee has also planned a Stewardship Campaign called "Give One" to begin April 14, the week after the Faith Lift event. For 3 weeks, we will have members give their testimonials, and on May 5, we will ask the congregation to prayerfully consider pledging one step up from their current giving.

It is our prayer that the Faith Lift and Give One campaign will ignite a fire in people's hearts.




